Big Ticket | Sold for \$9.79 million

A five-bedroom penthouse at the Laureate, a new condominium at Broadway and 76th Street, was the biggest sale of the week, going for \$9.79 million, according to city records.

Emulating the success of 15 Central Park West, the Robert A. M. Stern building a few blocks away, the Laureate is nearly sold out, and some apartments have commanded more than \$3,000 per square foot. Which seems to support the thesis that when it comes to luxury living, retro is all the rage on the Upper West Side.

The 3,500-square-foot penthouse was designed to resemble the kind of elegant apartment built in the neighborhood a century ago, with a grand foyer, oversize rooms and soaring ceilings. The listing also describes a chef's kitchen designed by Deborah Berke with white painted cabinetry, a quartzite counter, a stainless-steel backsplash and top-of-the-line appliances.

Shlomi Reuveni, who is leading the sales team for Brown Harris Stevens, declined to comment on the sale. The apartment was bought anonymously through a limited-liability company, according to city records.

Big Ticket includes closed sales from the previous week, ending Wednesday.
